Between 11:30 and 1:00 p.m. Bill will

be discussing the murder and signing copies of his book in the school library. The general public is invited.


"Murder in the Schoolhouse" is the story of the 1954 murder of Steve Klapouschak who was the teacher in the one room schoolhouse in Dalton. Dalton is a small community 44 miles west of Chapleau on the main

line of the Canadian Pacific Railway.

Klapouschak was killed by Robert Bruce Ducsharm, a C.P.R. Extra Gang worker. His Preliminary Hearing was held in Chapleau and, after two trials in Sudbury, Ducsharm was hanged in the Sudbury Jail on June 15, 1956. Many well known Chapleau and area residents were witnesses at the

preliminary hearing and the trials.

Bill McLeod was born and raised in Chapleau and graduated from Chapleau High School in 1960. He is also the author of "The Chapleau Game Preserve: History, Murder and Other Tales" and numerous books and articles on life insurance, mutual funds and family finance.

Can Conservatives Keep Canada Out of the Red?

Liberals Finance critics are calling on the Conservatives to keep Canada's books balanced following a new report from a

major credit rating agency which predicts Canada is on the brink of going into deficit for the first time in over a decade.

The report from the Dominion Bond Rating Service (DBRS) says "it is likely that the government would run its first budgetary deficit" if economic growth for the coming year doesn't meet government expectations.

If this happens it would be the first time the Government of Canada runs a deficit since the previous Liberal government with the

help of hard working Canadians eliminated the \$42-billion deficit left behind by Brian Mulroney's Conservatives. The Liberal Party's economic strength has resulted in a string of eight consecutive surpluses, a streak DBRS says the current Conservative government has put in jeopardy.

Liberals Finance Critic John McCallum, who is a former senior vice president and chief economist for the Royal Bank, as well as a former professor of economics expressed his worry that the Conservatives are not good economic

managers. Associate Liberal Finance Critic Martha Hall Findlay also noted that Conservative governments have a long history of running deficits in Canada. Between 1918 and 2005, not a single Conservative Prime Minister ran a balanced budget. From Meighen to Bennett, and from Diefenbaker to Mulroney, Conservative prime ministers have shown no reservations about deficit financing, and it appears that Stephen Harper is the same.

Liberals put this country back on solid economic

footing, all while cutting taxes. At the same time Jim Flaherty, as then-Conservative Ontario Finance Minister, left Ontario with a \$5.6-billion deficit. True to form, he has now brought down the two largest-spending budgets in Canadian history, putting Canada at the risk of deficit. In the face of global economic instability Canadians want a proven, steady Liberal hand on the wheel to navigate the country through rough economic waters.

Recently, the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives warned that the Conservatives have left the cupboards dry and "it would not take much of a drop in economic growth before the budget returned to deficit."

Reports such as these should sound alarm bells for the Conservatives. It remains to be seen if they will take any action to correct their own mistakes.

Ontario Greenhouse Vegetables: How to care, store & select



CUCUMBERS

How to care and store English seedless cucumbers.

Refrigeration before use is not necessary with English seedless greenhouse cucumbers. Ontario Greenhouse cucumbers do NOT

require peeling. Their thin, un-waxed skin is completely edible.

English seedless cucumbers are wrapped in plastic to seal-in their natural moisture and prolong shelf life. You can store them in a cool place for up to 10 days. Because of the plastic seal, they do not require waxing, so their edible skin has no bitter taste—just slice and enjoy!

You can use as much of the cucumber as you need, then fold the plastic over and save the rest for next time.

How to care and store mini cucumbers

Greenhouse grown mini cucumbers are increasingly popular, especially with kids. Up to 15 cm long and weighing 150-200 g, they are sweet and aromatic and have an edible skin. They may be kept about a week in the refrigerator crisper or two weeks if packed in cling-film. Avoid storing cucumbers with fruits that produce the natural ripening agent ethylene, such as apples, pears and bananas.

How to select

Look for cucumbers that are a deep, vivid green

colour. They should be blemish-free and heavy for their size. Check to ensure there are no soft spots or blemishes, especially at the ends.

TOMATOES

How to care and store NEVER refrigerate tomatoes—it spoils their taste and ruins their texture. Ontario Greenhouse tomatoes should be stored in a cool location, ideally at 13 to 15 degrees Celsius, or 55 to 60 degrees Fahrenheit, out of direct sunlight.

How to select

Look for tomatoes that are plump, firm, free of surface cracks and



bruises and heavy for their size. Selecting tomatoes that are at varying degrees of ripeness will ensure that you have perfect tomatoes every day of the week!

PEPPERS

How to care and store Greenhouse peppers are best stored in the refrigerator until you are ready to use them. Rinse in cold water

before food preparation. Remove the core and seeds; cut into bite-size pieces or strips. Great raw, in stir-fries, baked, grilled or roasted. How to select

Choose sweet peppers that are smooth, firm and plump with thick shiny skins. Make sure that there are no cracks or soft spots. only.

CPSO issues record-breaking number of new licenses



CNW/ - A report released today by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario (CPSO) shows that more doctors were registered to practice in 2007 than ever before. The number of doctors licensed surpassed the 2006 record total by 11%.

The report,

Reaping the Rewards - Striving for Sustainability, contains both licensing statistics and the findings of the CPSO annual survey of physicians in practice, and shows that a record-breaking 3,279 certificates were issued last year. For the fourth straight year, more certificates were

issued to international medical graduates (IMGs) than to Ontario graduates.

"Ontario patients are reaping the rewards of more doctors in practice," said CPSO President Dr. Preston Zuliani. "Many important policies and programs collaboratively developed by the CPSO, government, medical schools, and other stakeholders are increasing the overall physician supply," said Dr. Zuliani, a family physician from St. Catharines. Last year alone, an additional 290 physicians were accepted into practice in Ontario who otherwise would not have been eligible for a license but for CPSO registration policies and programs.

The survey findings indicate that the proportion of physicians practicing in clinical groups is significantly increasing and that those who work in a clinical group are more likely to be accepting new patients. The survey also reveals a

slight increase in the overall number of family physicians accepting new patients (10% up from 9.6% in 2006). For the first time in seven years, the downward trend is stabilizing.

"While Ontario is benefiting from the record-breaking number of newly registered doctors, the CPSO will continue to collaborate with the government and other partners to improve access to care for

patients. We must strive for sustainability as the physician population ages," said Dr. Zuliani.

Other key highlights include:

- "Overall supply of physicians in practice is up 13% in the last decade (from 20,053 to 22,725);
- "1,410 practice certificates (excluding educational certificates) were issued in 2007 - the highest annual total since 1993.
- "38% of practice

certificates went to IMGs; 37% to Ontario graduates.

The CPSO survey has a 96% response rate, exceeding that of any other known physician survey in Canada. The report focuses on the 22,793 physicians who have active, independent practice license status, with a primary practice address in Ontario. The full report is available online at www.cspo.on.ca under What's New.

Peanut Butter Brown Sugar Scones

(NC)—The secret to these scones is to use cold shortening and peanut butter when you mix them up... this gives scones a light yummy texture. Serve them right out of the oven and they'll disappear before your eyes. (But mom will definitely approve.)

Scones

2 cups Robin Hood Nutri Flour Blend
500mL
1/2 cup brown sugar 125mL
4 tsp baking powder 20 mL
1/4 tsp salt 1mL
3/4 cup Jif Creamy Peanut Butter, cold
175mL
1/3 cup Crisco All Vegetable Shortening,
cold 75mL
1 egg 1
1/2 cup milk 125 mL

Topping

1/2 cup chopped, salted peanuts 125 mL

1/3 cup brown sugar 75 mL
Preheat oven to 425°F (220°C). Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
Combine flour, brown sugar, baking power and salt in a medium sized bowl.

Cut in shortening and peanut butter until mixture resembles coarse meal. Add egg and milk, stirring with a fork to create a soft, slightly sticky dough. Knead gently and press dough into a ball. Place remaining brown sugar and peanuts on work surface. Press dough into mixture and shape into 3/4" (2cm) thick round. Turn dough over and

press into any remaining mixture. Cut into 12 triangles and place on prepared cookie sheet.

Bake in preheated oven for 12-15 minutes or until golden. Let cool on racks.

This is why our government, in the 2008 Ontario Budget, committed \$154 million over three years to increase the early detection and facilitate treatment of breast, cervical and colorectal cancers. This investment will

also include funding to extend the human papillomavirus virus (HPV) vaccination program. HPV is a common sexually transmitted disease that causes cervical cancer. Last fall, the Ontario government made the three-dose vaccination program available to approximately 84,000 young women in Grade Eight.

But this is just the tip of the iceberg in our efforts to fight cancer.

Our government is working with

Cancer Care Ontario and the Ontario Medical Association to identify, target and reduce the number of cancer-causing agents released into the environment.

We are proposing to ban smoking in cars where children are present, to ensure one of the most vulnerable segments of our society are no longer exposed to the cancer-causing effects of second-hand smoke.

We are proposing to make the Retail Sales Tax exemption for qualifying nicotine replacement therapies permanent, to assist smokers in their efforts to quit. And effective May 31, 2008, we are banning completely the displaying of tobacco products as originally set out in the Smoke-Free Ontario Act.

This government is committed to not only fight cancer, but to address the root causes in an effort to promote wellness and prevent illness. We recognize that cancer is the leading cause of



Planning and planting your garden oasis

(NC)—Gardening not only connects us to planet Earth, but allows us to enjoy the many fruits of our labour with colourful blooms all season long. Prior to planting, The Home Depot Canada has put together tips to help you plan and cultivate your garden oasis.

vine vegetables.

Try xeriscaping. This is an environmentally friendly form of landscaping that uses a variety of indigenous and drought-tolerant plants, shrubs and ground cover. This self-sustaining garden is low maintenance

because the native plants thrive in their local environment, providing a habitat for local wildlife.

Eco maintenance. Rich compost is one of the best things you can feed your garden. Using a compost bin creates a cozy place for micro-

organisms to convert organic waste into a soil-like substance.

Also, consider using a rain barrel that connects directly to your eavestrough downspout and take advantage of the season's downpours while saving on water.
