## Chapleau's Mya Prusky wins Gold in Elements, Spins and Short Program

Mya Prusky, one of the most promising skaters in her class at the 2010 James Bay Interclub figure skating competitions held in Timmins this past weekend, set an example for Canada's Olympic Skating Team, taking away three Gold Medals.

The young star, daughter of Doug and Tina (Cappellani) Prusky, of Chapleau Ontario, picked up three gold medals in each of the three classes she entered. On

Saturday morning, starting with the Elements category, Mya excelled in her group, not only grabbing her first Gold, but followed up on Sunday with her second, gold in the Spins category. She topped it off with a Gold Medal in the Solo Short Program.

"I came here to have a good time", she said to her mom, after the competition; "My coach tricked me", alluding to the message that it's important for kids to enjoy these meets, rather than focus only on the win. But win she

did, much to the excitement of her coach (Nadia), teary-eyed mom, and very proud dad, Doug Prusky.

The family, along with Mya's great aunt, Hilda Ritchie travelled from Chapleau for the event, braving the 230 km trip in under minus-thirty degree weather.

Other fans in the crowd included Lark and Connie Ritchie, two glamour-hound vagabonds from Porcupine who scrambled after the petite star, seeking autographs. "I was

really excited when she agreed to sign my paper" exclaimed Lark; "See, she wrote 'Love, Mya Prusky!'" showing the signature to those around him.

"I'll treasure it for a very long time!"

Mya returns to Chapleau to continue her training, and to participate in the Chapleau Figure Skating Club's annual extravaganza, later this season. Fans in Chapleau are eagerly awaiting that venue, and a chance to see this pretty bundle of energy glide across the ice and just as easily, into their hearts.

## Soccer rebirth in Chapleau

# March 8th - International Women's Day

Each year on International Women's Day, in communities around the world, women gather to celebrate the political, economic and social achievements of women. Women's accomplishments are recognized with no regard to divisions, whether national, ethnic, linguistic, cultural, economic or political. Since 1975, March 8th has been designated as a day to remember where women have been and celebrate where we are today. We recognize those whose struggles have achieved for us the successes we currently enjoy.

Most of the readers will not remember a time when women in Canada were denied the right to vote; most will not remember the struggle in the early 1900's to

have women declared "persons" for purposes of holding political office. Most of us do not give a second thought to the right of women to participate in sports activities and paid employment. We take these rights for granted. Yet these rights were not always afforded to us - each was won for us through the tireless efforts of a dedicated woman or group of women. She, or they, demanded that the rights afforded to men be extended to women, and that is why we enjoy the measure of equality we do today.

However, although we are now in the 21st century, women and girls around the globe continue to experience injustice. In a large slice of the world, girls

are denied access to education, and women are marginalized. Mortality rates for girl babies are high because they do not receive the same medical care as do boy babies; "bride burnings" continue to happen, young girls are kidnapped and trafficked into brothels, in conditions rivalling those of slavery. Women are among the poorest inhabitants of the globe, often receiving no pay for their work. "Women do two-thirds of the world's work, receive 10% of the world's income and own 1% of the means of production." (Richard H. Robbins, Global Problems and the Culture of Capitalism, (Allyn and Bacon, 1999), p.354)

As we celebrate the progress made by women around the globe this International Women's Day; as women come together in unity, to network and mobilize for meaningful change, let's not forget the political and human rights theme of the day as well. Although, in Canada, women have made great strides towards achieving equality, we

are a minority - the majority of women around the world continue to live under very oppressive conditions. Until all women are equally respected and honoured, we are all diminished. So, on International Women's Day, we remember the victories and celebrate, and consider the work remaining and resolve to carry on, until future generations of women are free, everywhere, to realize their potential. We act locally, but think globally.

With that thought in mind, on the local level, it is time once again to think about the women who live with and around you, and express your appreciation for their contributions to you and to the community. # Highway 129 connecting Chapleau to outside world completed in winter of 1949

While it was often referred to as "a turkey trail through the bush," on January 30, 1949, in the midst of winter, Highway 129 was officially completed.

Since 1885 when Chapleau was founded as a divisional point on the Canadian Pacific Railway, train travel was the only viable way of getting to and from the community. In 1947 the longest drive anyone could take was about 35 miles from town and the motor vehicle was considered a luxury. As a youngster I recall them arriving by rail at the old freight sheds on Lisgar Street.

A highway had been promised for many years and activity would begin around election time but after the votes were counted, it would cease. However, in 1948, a disastrous forest fire changed the dynamics as the provincial government offered opportunities to lumber companies.

Therefore, Highway 129 was completed to Thessalon, and turkey trail it may have been, but a highway was a

highway, and it was a first step in improving Chapleau's transportation links with the outside world.

One of the major proponents for a highway over the years was Thomas Godfrey Sr. Mr. Godfrey, who was one of the early builders of Chapleau, played many roles in community life. He was reeve from 1914 to 1916, and at various times owned the pool room, the old as in "old old" arena on Lorne Street, as well as being an insurance agent, Notary Public and Indian Agent. He was also an inventor and long time member of the Chapleau Town Band where he played the euphonium.

Writing in Chapleau Trails, edited and published by Dr. W.R. "Bill" Pellow, Betty (Good) Godfrey, the wife of Thomas Godfrey Jr. wrote the following about her father-in-law and the completion of Highway 129.

"Tom Sr. lived to see his beloved Chapleau highway completed in 1949 and he was a member of the party that drove the first automobile across those last one

hundred yards to join Chapleau to the outside world by uniting two primitive bush roads. It was winter. The snow was heavy and deep. It was bitter cold day. The drive had been long and arduous, excitement was high, anticipation of this moment was trying on the healthiest and bravest, however it proved too much for Tom Godfrey and on that day when he was experiencing fulfillment, ultimate pleasure and satisfaction, he had a heart attack and died."

Interestingly the first car that made the trip over the new highway was not one from Chapleau it was a northbound car from Thessalon

owned by Frank Korpela and driven by Tom Carter. The Chapleau group heading south had turned back to Chapleau after the death of Mr. Godfrey. The car was new and was equipped with chains and snow tires.

According to a report in the February 3, 1949 Chapleau Post, there were bad road conditions and it was heavy with snow.

The report said that snow was measured on several occasions and was 8-10 inches on the highway and it was often necessary to stop and clear the snow from the grills of the car. On a few occasions it was necessary to shovel drifts in order to get through.

The two men did not make the trip in one day. They left Thessalon about 9:30 a.m in the morning but stopped at Lessards Camp along the way and finished the drive into Chapleau the next morning.

For some reason after the highway opened, the department of highways paved about a twelve mile stretch in the middle of nowhere near Aubrey Falls. I think they said they wanted to check the durability of pavement in a harsh climate.

Over the years Highway 129 was improved, but to me at least, it was always an adventure to travel it. By the Sixties, Highway 101 had

been completed between Chapleau and Timmins and Wawa. However, the Ramsey Road continues to be a project unfulfilled for at least the past 50 years as promises are made and then broken to finally complete it.


However, Tom Godfrey Sr. and all those pioneer community builders deserve much credit, even to this day, on their efforts to open Chapleau to the outside world.





# Prevent frostbite and hypothermia

Hypothermia and frostbite are the most common but preventable injuries that result from being exposed to the cold.

Frostbite is the freezing of a body part. The nose, cheeks, ears, fingers and toes are usually frostbitten first. The skin feels cold and may feel numb. If

frostbite is suspected, cover the area immediately. Do not rub or massage the skin. This can cause tissue damage. If possible, gently place the affected area in warm – not hot – water until it is warm and no longer numb. Apply a sterile dressing to the area. Put dressings between fingers and

toes if they are affected. Medical attention is recommended for frostbite.

To prevent frostbite, always wear hats, mittens, and scarves. Avoid tight-fitting boots because they make the feet more vulnerable to frostbite. Wear several thin layers of warm, dry clothing.

Hypothermia is a life-threatening condition. It happens when the body is exposed to the cold for a long time and the body loses more heat than it can generate. The individual may be shivering, drowsy, and confused, and have slurred speech, loss of coordination, and pale and bluish lips. The condition becomes severe when the victim stops shivering. Unconsciousness may soon follow. Treat hypothermia by moving the victim to shelter, replacing wet clothing with dry clothing, and wrapping them in warm blankets. Keep the person lying flat

and get immediate medical attention.

To stay safe in cold weather, pay attention to weather reports, dress warmly, keep active, and avoid alcohol and caffeine.



## Ice Hut Registration Required On Area Lakes

To protect the environment and ensure safety, anglers must register new or previously unregistered ice fishing huts on area lakes.

Registration is free and helps prevent anglers from abandon-

ing their huts. Abandoned huts can end up in waterways when the ice thaws.

Huts must be registered in Fishery Management Zone 10 in Chapleau District. To register your ice hut contact Fishery Management

Zone 10 call the local ministry office @ 705-864-1710. Generally, this may be done over the telephone. Once registered, an ice fishing hut can be used anywhere in Ontario. Anglers must remove ice huts from the waters

of Zone 10 by March 31st. It's a good idea to place huts on 15 cm (six-inch) high wooden blocks to make it easier to remove them at the end of the season. Ice hut owners must keep the area around their huts clear of garbage.

Registration

numbers on ice huts must be at least 6.3 centimetres (2.5 inches) in height and clearly displayed on the outside of the hut. Tent-style ice huts made of cloth or synthetic fabric that have a base area of seven square metres (75.4 square feet) or

less when erected do not need to be registered.

It is an offence under the Public Lands Act to leave an ice hut out after ice break up regardless of whether registration and removal dates apply.


