It was no surprise to many when the Chapleau Nature Festival announced early in the season that Festival Passes were selling like hotcakes.

This line-up of star performers, along with the ever increasing list of competitors in the fiddling and step dancing competitions, have helped make this community's Festival a winning formula.

The 2005 edition of the Nature Festival underwent some administrative

changes, although the program of activities remained true to the Festival's previous 3 years. The new Festival Coordinator, Gail Donovan, with the assistance of staff members Judy Imbeault and Mark Morin, were fit for the task, and their performance is worthy of praise.

This year, the Township of Chapleau took over the financial management of the Festival, helping provide a solid backbone for the

event's budget of over \$150,000. The Festival helps generate more than ½ million dollars in the local economy during the four-day celebration.

The Centre Culturel Louis-Hémon continued to provide the logistical support, thanks to the organization's proven track record with the successful execution of the first 3 Festivals. Chapleau's Festival is now used as an example in an instructional CD manual for rural communities organizing special events or festivals. The CD has been distributed throughout Canada.

Concert goes and outdoors enthusiasts alike have once again endorsed the Chapleau Nature Festival, as reservations for all individual activities has been brisk, and at last count, a fair number of them have been booked solid.

Chapleau can be proud of its accomplishments through this Festival. Not only does it provide some economic benefits to

the local businesses, it also contributes to showcasing the community's distinct character and the region's natural treasures. And as an added plus, the Festival helps promote a spirit of cooperation among locals, as well as

building community pride.

Science North Summer Camp in Chapleau

Local children have the opportunity to experience one more advantage, that previously was only available to city kids, here in Chapleau this summer.

The week of July 18th to 22nd, Science North from Sudbury offered a day camp program in both French and English to boys and girls in the Chapleau area. The camps were run from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at the Sacred Heart

school. The campers brought their lunches and had free time to play during lunch hour.

The group of four instructors were able to provide a 6:1 ratio for the children who ranged in age from 4 to 12 years of age. Two of the instructors work at the day camp as summer employment, since they are still students themselves studying teaching and engineering. One of the instructors has just graduated college

while the fourth instructor also acts as supervisor. This supervisor, Renelle Tousignant, is the director of Science North Summer Camp as an intern at Science North in Sudbury. She has a 1 year contract position there.

The 3 different day camps offered throughout the week were Kinderkids, Gadget camp, and Discovery camp. Each of the camps had a good turn out although attendance fluctuated a

little bit each day. Although the kids were separated into their groups most of the time, they played some games as a group and got together to make edible aquariums out of blue Jello to bring home.

During Kinderkids camp, the children made play dough, experimented with magnets, and learned about the senses.

The Gadget camp focused on such things as Morse code, catapults, and Gadget cars. These cars were the main project of the Gadget camp program. To make these cars, the kids had to take apart electronic equipment which they would 'sell' to the store councillor. From there, the students

would 'buy' items to add to their cars to customize them. Once they built the vehicle of their scientific dreams, they would race them against each other. It was basically an exercise in engineering with a fun twist.

"If we can only offer one camp then Discovery camp is the one we offer," Renelle Tousignant explained. It is the one camp that offers a variety of different experiments which helps the children discover science they prefer. This way, in the future, the children can sign up for a camp which is most interesting to them.

Discovery camp is therefore a mixture of all of the

science camps put together. They study chemical reactions, engineering, and nature. Throughout the week the children made paper, had a tower building contest and conducted some ph indicator experiments. They made mini rockets with the help of Alka Seltzer and water. A test tube and some potassium chlorate proved to be a torture chamber for some ill-fated Gummi Bears. On the last day of the week, the Discovery campers were to build an amusement park with K'nex pieces.

Looks like the experiment to discover Chapleau's budding scientists was a success!

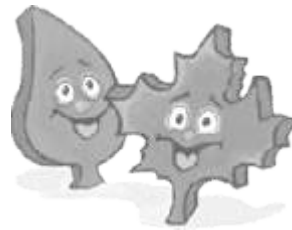

Northern pike, pickerel, whitefish, lake trout, perch, largemouth and smallmouth bass are predominant.
