Water plant mortgage up in flames

The match was put to the mortgage on the Chapleau Municipal Water Treatment Plant in a burning ceremony during last Monday's regular Township Council meeting.

While the plant has continued to serve the municipality, it's early days were surrounded by a certain amount of controversy, as one Councillor of the day insisted the original financing of the project was a poor deal, and spearheaded a drive to have a new financing arrangement.

The final deal, which was a result of intense lobbying by Councillor Elmer Freeborn, was responsible for saving the township over a half million dollars.

The initial funding arrangement, which Councillor Freeborn described as being "unique" was made by a previous council.

"It was hard to believe that the set-up provided for deficit financing of the Plant and each year's deficit was rolled over into the next succeeding year and accrued compound

interest along the way year after year," said Elmer Freeborn in a brief history, which culminated in the Council of the day supporting his request to meet in Toronto with provincial government officials to renegotiate the deal.

It appeared that the Township would be retiring very little of the debt load for many years and would in all likelihood never take over ownership of the Plant.

According to the former Councillor the Township was under receivership when the funding arrangement was revealed and the Ministry of Municipal Affairs, who was providing the leadership, was also not aware of the funding arrangement which would have seen Chapleau paying for the plant until 2023.

Two delegations made to Toronto failed to obtain any changes in the funding.

Then Councillor Freeborn received approval from the Council, all apparently not aware of the financing agreement, to prepare a submission and meet

once more with the Province. He was prepared to do this while in Toronto on business for his employer so it would not cost the Township any expenses.

Along with Reeve Bill Howard, Councillor Freeborn presented his new funding formula to the province's Water Division Manager who agreed with the argument and recommended it to cabinet.

A short time after this meeting the Township was provided a loan and an interest rate which was favourable.

"So here we are

in 2005," stated Freeborn as the mortgage faded into ashes. "The Water Plant is fully paid for and the Township has full ownership of the plant. The overall savings to the Township between the two funding arrangements amounted to approximately \$500,000.00," said Freeborn.

Cause of smelly air at High Schools identified

That odour which resulted in the closure of the building housing Chapleau's two high schools has been identified as low levels of Hydrogen Sulfide.

The students were sent home after a smell in the air and some complaint of eye irritation on the morning of Friday, February 18th.

The building is home to Chapleau High School and École secondaire catholique Trillium.

In a letter included in the Township Council's agenda last Monday, Bob Backstrom, superintendent of Business for the Algoma District School Board, said air quality testing indicated low levels of hydrogen sulfide in the air.

The smell and irritant in the air on Friday were a product of incomplete combustion being

discharged from the heating unit via the stack.

A weather-temperature inversion caused the fumes to enter the school via windows and the ventilation system.

"Heating experts have corrected the incomplete combustion problem in order to provide a high level of safety," stated Backstrom.

In the meantime, the School Board has continued to monitor conditions in the building and find the hydrogen sulfide level readings below the exposure limits as recommended by the Occupational Health and Safety Act of Ontario.

The level readings have been zero since February 19. Although preventative steps have been taken, air quality readings will continue to be monitored as technical staff follow up to fully investigate the cause of the earlier readings.

Son of the late Bruce and Beatrice (Campbell), and cherished brother of Clair (Audrey) Crozier of Kensington, Prince Edward Island, Lillian (Orville) Robinson of Chapleau, Ontario, Dorothy (Cecil) Thrasher of Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, and Thane (Helen) Crozier of Elliot Lake, Ontario. Predeceased by sisters Shirley (Dick) Couling, and baby Esther. Sadly missed by children Kerry (David) Dunlop, Cathy (Gary) Keast, both of Forest, Ontario, Bruce (Lisa) Crozier of Bright's Grove, Ontario, and Melanie (Kelly Roundell) Crozier of London, Ontario. Leigh was born in Darnley, Prince Edward Island on January 6, 1933, and proudly resided in Forest, Ontario for 35 years. A student of the University of Western Ontario, the University of Toronto, and Osgoode Hall Law School, he was called to the bar and admitted as solicitor in 1958, and appointed Queen's Counsel in 1971. He practiced law in Sarnia for 9 years, and then in Forest for 23 years. Appointed Deputy Judge in Provincial and Small Claims Courts in 1988, Leigh retired from Law in 1997. He was very proud of his community, and became actively involved in the Rotary Club of Forest and the Forest Excelsior Band, and was one of the founders of the North Lambton Arthritis and Rheumatism Society, the North Lambton Chamber of Commerce, and the North Lambton Benefit Foundation. He was also the volunteer coordinator of the North Lambton Community Health Centre, as well as the chairman of the Forest Rotary Library Building Fund and many other local and international activities. Leigh had a particular interest in municipal and provincial politics and held the position of Reeve of Forest 1978-1980, Deputy Reeve of Forest 1981-1982, and member of Lambton County Council 1979-1982. Leigh has won many distinguished awards, including the Paul Harris Fellowship, the Outstanding Achievement Award for Volunteerism, the Golden Jubilee Award, and the Canada 125th Anniversary Medal. His interests included family, fun parties, the environment, and health issues, and he was an avid reader of Canadian history and "good, clean, murder mysteries."

Leigh's family will host a celebration of life on Saturday, March 5, 2005 at 7:00 pm at the Forest Legion, Branch 176, Albert St., Forest, Ontario to celebrate this kind, fun-loving, intelligent man's contribution to his family, friends, and community. All are welcome. Hi, My name is Ryan Saari, I am the Operations Manager for True North Timber.

Being an entrepreneur excites me. It is a great challenge with lots of room for growth. We built True North Timber on the basis of providing jobs for Chapleau people first. It hasn't been easy but it has turned out well. Albert is my motivation. He said "he saw something in me". It was great encouragement and a good opportunity. I thank him for that. I didn't have to go

away to study because I was able to be trained first hand by my dad. This is the same way he was taught by his father. My dad taught me everything I know. He is and always will be my teacher. Without his training I definitely would have had to go away to study. Also, I often get advice from my uncles. I never thought about moving away, I love the North. I stayed in Northern Ontario because I'm in forestry. This is the best place to work in this field. When we established True North Timber we were employing approximately ten

people. To date approximately eighty-six people directly or indirectly depend on True North Timber for their employment. Knowing this fills me with pride and lets me sleep well knowing that we are helping our small northern Ontario town. In my opinion the advantages of living in Northern Ontario are that it's a peaceful and tranquil environment, good family values, small town feeling, you know everybody, less crime therefore safer environment providing more freedom, fresh air and finally everyone has to learn how to make their own fun not to be dependent on others for their happiness.

Public Inspection Approved 2005/2006 Annual Work Schedule Pineland-Martel Forest

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) has approved the 2005/2006 annual work schedule for the Pineland-Martel Forest. The annual work schedule describes forest management activities (e.g. timber harvesting, regeneration, tending, aerial application of herbicide, road construction and slash pile burning) that will or may occur between April 1, 2005 and March 31, 2006.

These activities are consistent with the forest management plan which was approved through public consultation. A mapped summary of the scheduled forest management operations is available by contacting the ministry's Chapleau District Office (see address below).

Fuelwood is available for harvest on this forest management unit. Information on the location of specific fuelwood areas is available at the ministry address below. Please contact the ministry for a fuelwood permit before harvesting fuelwood.

Tree planting is to be conducted by private contractors. For a list of tree planting contractors and tree planting opportunities please contact:

Proposed Administrative Amendment Superior Forest Management Plan (2001-2021)

The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) and Tembec Industries Inc. (Chapleau Division) in consultation with the Superior Forest Local Citizens Committee invite you to comment on a proposed administrative amendment to the 2001-2021 forest management plan for the Superior Forest in the Chapleau District.

The purpose of this amendment is to ensure an appropriate level of remoteness is maintained on the designated Tourism Lake, Embarrass Lake. As such, the Ministry of Natural Resources has requested Tembec Industries Inc. to restrict the use of the Kebiskowashteh Primary Access Road of unauthorized vehicles. This access restriction will restrict the use of the Kebiskowashteh Primary Access Road to all unauthorized vehicles on a year round basis, with the exception of the forest industry, who will be permitted to use the road for forest management purposes, and the local trapper, who will be permitted use of the road for a defined period of time annually to carry out trapping activities.

MNR is requesting your input into the proposed amendment, inviting you to provide your comments within the 30 day comment period, which expires on April 12, 2005. Please write or contact us to give us your comments on this matter at the address below.

This amendment proposal will be approved shortly thereafter, subject to the review of comments received. Further public consultation may be required depending upon comments received in response to this notice. An established issue-resolution process is available for issues that may arise during the review of this amendment.

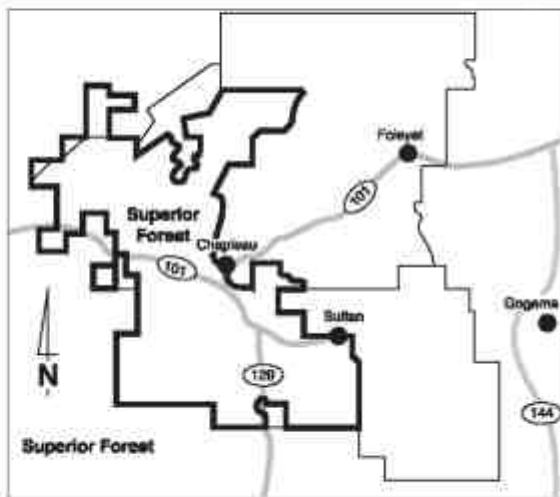
