Firefighters recognized for lengthy service

Two of Chapleau's firefighters were honoured last Monday for a combined total of more than a half-century of service to their community.

In a brief ceremony prior to the regular municipal council meeting, Fire Chief Graham Bertrand received a pair of 30-year bars from each of the Federal and Provincial governments recognizing his long service.

At the same time, Captain Murray Midkiff was honoured and presented with a Provincial medal marking his quarter century milestone of

dedication to the community as a firefighter.

The decorations were presented by Clair Rouse, a representative from the Ontario Fire Marshall's Office, who was in Chapleau conducting a training session for the members of the volunteer fire department.

Chapleau Township Deputy Mayor Andre Byham said usually volunteers serve for eight or nine years, so that in the case of these two men, their records are exemplary. "They should be recognized for their work and dedication," stated the deputy mayor, adding, "these are the people who are

on the front lines putting others first. It is a position which requires a serious commitment."

Volunteering as a firefighter is a rewarding and life-changing experience for those who sign on for a position that requires a serious commitment.

Volunteer firefighters frequently are called upon to perform extremely hard and skilled physical work under adverse conditions. Firefighters not only fight fires, but also respond to calls during storms, persons in a variety of stressful situations including traffic accidents.

Avoid handling bats this summer

The Sudbury & District Health Unit is reminding the public that the summer weather brings an increased risk of contact with bats. Bats can carry rabies, an infectious viral disease that affects the nervous system of humans and other mammals. If left untreated, rabies is fatal in humans.

The health unit saw a significant increase in the number of reported bat exposures during the summer of 2007 with 43 bat exposures being reported. Fifteen bats were submitted for testing. Two bats tested positive for rabies. Thirty-eight people received rabies vaccine in 2007 following

exposure.

"We cannot predict what the bat activity will be for 2008 but we would like to remind everyone to avoid handling bats to reduce the risk of exposure to the rabies virus," says Richard Auld, an environmental support officer in the health unit's Environmental Health Division. "It is especially important to remind children not to touch bats," he adds.

People may become infected with rabies when bitten or scratched by a rabid bat or when a rabid bat's saliva comes into contact with broken skin or moist tissues of the mouth, nose or eyes.

Rabid bats are rarely aggressive. A bat may be rabid if it is active by day, if it is found in a place where bats are not usually seen, and/or if it is unable to fly. These bats are often easily approached but should never be touched.

A bat has sharp, needle-like teeth that may cause a relatively painless bite that is not easy to see. If you are bitten by a bat, or if saliva from a bat gets into your eyes, nose, mouth, or a wound, wash the affected area thoroughly with soap

and water. Get medical advice immediately and report the incident to the Sudbury & District Health Unit.

If there is no sign of a bite wound, you should still call the Sudbury & District Health Unit at 522-9200, ext. 398, or toll-free at 1-866-522-9200 when:

-A bat lands on a person
-A person wakes up to find a bat in the room

-A bat is found in the room of a person unable to report contact, such as an infant

The best way to

prevent human exposure is to keep bats out of your home and cottage. This can be done by covering all outside points of entry. Watch where the bat exits at dusk and keep them from re-entering by hanging loose plastic sheeting or bird netting over these areas. After the bats have left, permanently seal the openings.

The best time to "bat-proof" your home or cottage is in the fall when most bats have left to hibernate. This involves caulking holes in the building's

exterior even those as small as ¼ to ½ inch in diameter.

Tighten screens, cap the chimney, place draft guards under doors leading to the attic and outside, and fill plumbing fixture holes with steel wool or caulk. For help with "bat-proofing", contact a pest management company.

The Ontario Ministry of Transportation (MTO) has completed the Preliminary Design Study and Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) for route selection and preliminary design for Highway 129 from 30.2 km north of Highway 554 northerly 20.8 km and Highway 556 from Highway 129 westerly 5.3 km in the District of Algoma as shown on the key plan. The study identified and evaluated new highway alignments and recommended a preferred plan for the sections of Highway 129 and Highway 556 within the study limits. The firm of McCormick Rankin Corporation (MRC) undertook this study on behalf of MTO.

The proposed undertaking involves design and operational improvements to Highway 129 and Highway 556. The improvements to Highway 129 will occur within the existing highway corridor within the study limits.

The study followed the *Class Environmental Assessment (EA) for Provincial Transportation Facilities* (2000) process for a Group 'B' project.

The Transportation Environmental Study Report (TESR) will be available for a 30-day review period at the locations listed below:



Over 4,700 students, staff and employees of the Board converged on


the downtown Sault Ste. Marie facility for a Mass of Unity to celebrate the H-SCDSB's 10th Anniversary.

Sudbury & District Health Unit lifts boil water advisory for Foleyet




