Vandalism hits taxpayers in the pocketbook



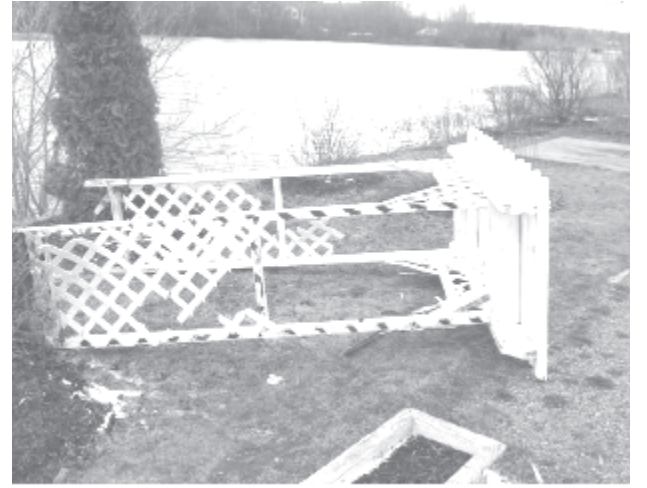
your property being damaged, it affects on a personal level.

Rose Bertrand, a retired long time employee of the

Ministry of Natural Offices filled the seat, vacated recently by Keith "Bud" Swanson who resigned because of illness.

The swearing in ceremony was brief as Justice of the Peace Rose Fortin administered the oath before the Council opened it's regular Monday meeting.

The new Councillor was welcomed by Chapleau Mayor Earle J. Freeborn. He stated Councillor Bertrand would be the balance to bring the woman's perspective to

Council. It's been a decade since a woman held a seat at the Council table. In the last municipal election, Bertrand placed fifth in the final balloting and therefore was next in line to fill any vacancy.

Councillor Bertrand takes her seat just as the Township is in the final stages of setting its new budget and is also preparing for a major public works project this summer. In the meantime, she has also accepted posts on the Economic Renewal Committee as well as

IMPROVING PUBLICLY FUNDED EDUCATION

One of the biggest ways that we can make a difference in the lives of our kids is by ensuring that they have access to the best publicly funded education possible.

We all have a role to play in the education of our children, and only by working together with the outstanding staff in

our schools can we ensure the best results. I'm sure we can all recall a teacher, principal, secretary or custodian who has had an important impact during our time at school, who has helped to guide us into becoming who we are today.

Every year during Education Week, which will be celebrated from April 28th to May 2nd this

year, we recognize some of these outstanding individuals with the Premier's Awards for Teaching Excellence. In Algoma-Manitoulin, Jonathan Young, a teacher from Elliot Lake Secondary School is the recipient of the Premier's Awards for Teaching Excellence in Leadership. These awards highlight how educators and support staff make a real difference in students' lives.

They are our partners in education, and through this partnership, Ontario has a publicly funded education system that is second to none. This partnership is a key element in the government's approach to education.

We listened when educators and parents said that they needed smaller class sizes. They told us that

students in smaller classes receive more attention and have greater success in the early grades. This makes it more likely that they will excel in high school, graduate and reach their full potential. Now, we have the biggest and most ambitious cap on class sizes in the country. As a result, parents are more confident in the high quality of their child's education, and teachers and support staff are able to work in a climate of support and respect for what they do.

Our strategy is working.

It is reflected in the test scores, where our Grade 3 and Grade 6 students are meeting the provincial standards in reading, writing and math. In fact, the standardized test results demonstrate improvement over the

last four years, rising by 10 per cent. The graduation rate has increased from 68 per cent in 2003, to 75 per cent today. More students are earning their high school diploma, which means more employment or post secondary education options. While we are pleased with this progress, we are not satisfied by it. Our goal is to have 85 per cent of students graduating by 2010-11.

As your MPP, I know that you share our goal of continuing to improve publicly funded education, and

by working together in partnership with educators across the province, I believe we can accomplish that goal.

Residents urged to come forward during National Volunteer Week, April 23-29

In proclaiming April 23-29 as National Volunteer Week, Chapleau Municipal Council also issued a plea to residents to come forward and fill positions on several of its committees.

Last Monday, when the Township Council authorized Mayor Earle J. Freeborn to issue a proclamation it discussed how to fill several committee

vacancies and at the same time, renewed a policy designed boost interest.

And while local residents may not have their sights set as high as the National Volunteer Week theme which is "Volunteer to Change the World," those who join the various committees of the Chapleau Council are almost certain to see their views have a direct impact on local policy.

While it is

increasingly difficult to attract volunteers to the committees, Council is hoping renewal of one past practice will change that.

Attendance by appointed members in both The Chapleau Economic Renewal Committee and Public Works Committee dropped when the practice of providing a small lunch to the noon hour meetings was ended.

Councillor Doug Greig, who serves as the Chair of the Public Works Committee has suggested a lack of a lunch for members whose full time jobs and other commitments resulting in tight schedules is creating the drop in regular attendance. He found support at the Council

table and it was decided to renew the practice of providing lunches which usually consist of a sandwich and fruit juice.

Councillor Jacques Tremblay, a schoolteacher and member of several committees, noted it was difficult to "pack a lunch" to attend some meetings at noon.

It was pointed out volunteers traditionally are a busy group and frequently attempt to squeeze in noon hour meetings at lunchtime. And Councillor Tremblay said other committees formed by Council faced similar low attendance numbers at evening meetings. "It's hard to get a quorum four out of five times,"

he stated.

Reinstating the lunches is another indication of the value Council places on the work of its committees. In what could be described as a "grass roots" exercise,

the Council frequently approves their recommendations.

Councillor Greg suggested the Township advertise to attract more members to join its various boards.

Health unit issues boil water advisory for Foleyet

The Sudbury & District Health Unit has issued a boil water advisory, effective immediately, for all residents of Foleyet who draw their water from the municipal water system. The health unit issued this advisory because of the flooding of the Foleyet River. Operations at the Foleyet Water Treatment Plant have been compromised due to the flood waters.

“Currently, we have no evidence of bacterial contamination,” says Nathalie Barsalou, a public health inspector with the health unit's Chapleau branch office. “However, testing is ongoing.”

A boil water advisory means that people who take their water from the municipal water system should not drink the water, use it to make infant formula or juices, use it to brush their teeth, or use it to wash foods such as fruit and vegetables that are to be consumed raw.

Water should be brought to a rolling boil and allowed to boil for one full minute. People should ensure that water used for cooking comes to a full boil. The water is safe for bathing and washing clothes.

The boil water advisory will remain in effect until further notice. Health unit staff continue to monitor the situation.
