Jordan Carroll adds to accolades as NOJHL scholastic player of the year

league first team all-star, paced all skaters in the NOJHL this season registering an impressive 136 points on 70 goals and 66 assists while only being held off the score sheet once in 50 regular season contests.

His tally total

was the most of any player in the entire CJHL and he was also second overall in total points. Carroll's offensive output was the most the NOJHL has seen in 20 years since John Stos racked up 173 points for the Rayside-Balfour Canadians in

1991-92, including 67 tallies.

That campaign two decades ago marked the most goals any skater in the NOJHL has scored since Carroll this season when Mike Dore lit the lamp 77 times in 44 games for Rayside-Balfour.

A banner season on the ice has been just as successful off it for Jordan Carroll of the Sudbury Cubs, who has been named the Northern Ontario Junior Hockey League's scholastic player of the year.

With the honour comes a \$1,000 scholarship on behalf of RBC to help defer costs of a post-secondary education.

Carroll also becomes the NOJHL's nominee for the Hockey Canada/Canadian Jr. Hockey League RBC scholastic player of the year award, which will be announced during the upcoming Royal

Bank Cup in Humboldt, Sask. That recipient will receive a \$5,000 scholarship.

A first-year student in the health and physical education program at Laurentian University in Sudbury, Carroll's prowess in the class room mirrored that of his efforts on the ice.

Earlier the five-foot-nine, 180-pound Cub's forward was named winner of the Carlo Cattarello Trophy, which is presented annually to the NOJHL's most valuable player. He will also serve as the league's nominee for the CJHL player of the year.



Bill Scheer sweeps regular season awards at Intermediate 'A' Huskies 1977 Awards Night featuring Timmins Mayor Mike Doody as guest speaker

Chapleau Moments

Despite the intense rivalry between the Chapleau Huskies and Timmins Northstars of the Northland Intermediate Hockey League, it did not prevent Timmins Mayor Mike Doody from accepting an invitation to Chapleau to be the guest speaker at the local team's annual award night in June 1977.

Also, before a packed house at the Moose Hall, Bill Scheer, in his first year with the Intermediate 'A' team, was the winner of four awards.

Master of Ceremonies Dr. Frank Broomhead got the evening started by introducing many of the guests who included Councillors George Evans, Dr. G.E. Young and Robert Lafreniere, Mr. Doody,

team manager Doug Prusky, assistant coach Art Madore, secretary-treasurer Denis Desbois, as well as former MPP for Nickel Belt Gaston Demers and Marty McAllister the PC candidate for Nickel Belt. Aldee Martel, of the Chapleau Junior 'B' Huskies was also introduced. I was the team's coach as well as reeve of Chapleau at the time.

Billy Scheer's parents were also in attendance, having travelled from Burlington for the occasion.

Councillor Evans brought greetings on behalf of the municipality saying it was an honour to welcome the distinguished guest speaker from Timmins and to congratulate the Huskies on their good

showing in the highly competitive league.

Dr. Broomhead added his congratulations noting that the Huskies had made the playoffs both years it had been in the league. Just for the historic record, the Huskies and the Northstars met in the league semi-finals in each of the four years Chapleau was in the NIHL -- and finally the Huskies beat them in year four. Trust me, it was like winning the Stanley Cup!

Councillor Lafreniere introduced Mayor Doody, who had moved to Timmins from Val D'or, and was also the sports director at CFCL Television. He had been a city alderman for six years and was elected to his first term as mayor in the 1976 election.

Mayor Doody congratulated the Huskies on their success and then surprised everyone by referring to a plaque that the Township of Chapleau had given to the City of Timmins thanking their citizens for assistance when

Chapleau was evacuated during the 1967 forest fire. Mr. Doody said he was made aware of it after becoming mayor.

On this, his first trip to Chapleau, he presented the municipality with a paperweight from his city.

It was then awards time and Bill Scheer was named most valuable player in regular season, leading scorer, rookie of the year and most sportsmanlike player.

Keith McAdam won the best defenceman trophy.

Another highlight of the evening was the introduction of a trophy to honour Thos. B. Welch, Buddy Swanson and Lorne Riley, the founders of the Chapleau Junior 'B' Huskies. Lorne Riley was on hand to present this trophy to Moe Poirier as the most valuable player in the playoffs. Tom, Buddy and Lorne had been

involved in Chapleau hockey for many years and from the ranks of their Junior 'B' teams were many players on the present Intermediate team.

The Denis Martel Trophy for Midget hockey leadership was presented to Danny Law by Midget coach David McMillan who played on the Intermediate 'A' Huskies. Denis had been a Midget championship winning coach.

David McMillan was also issuing challenges to teams to compete against the Huskies in upcoming bed races as part of Summerfest activities. The races

would start at the pedestrian overpass and end at the post office corner. Again for the historic record, the Huskies won the bed race championship and I rode on the bed wearing a helmet.

According to a report on the awards night in the Chapleau Sentinel, Dr. Broomhead called on Dave McMillan, to present a plaque "to the Chief" from "the Boys". It adds that I was "completely surprised and emotionally at a loss for words which he said didn't happen too often." That's true enough. My email is mj.morris@live.ca

Ontario Weather Review: March 2012

Forget merely balmy...March 2012 in Ontario was so warm, with so many records being set, that traditional trips south during March break seemed almost superfluous. It was the warmest March on record for many locations and, added to the previous mild months this winter, culminated in a record low snowfall total for the season for Toronto.

New marks were posted across the entire province for the highest mean temperatures, erasing marks that in some cases dated back to the

1940s. Differences from normal values ranged from 5.2 to 8.4°C. Differences to previous records were as high as the additional 3.4°C recorded in Wiarton.

On the precipitation front, northern Ontario was wetter than normal. A new rainfall record was set in Sioux Lookout, surpassing a mark that had stood since 1938. Meanwhile, southern Ontario was drier than normal.

Summary of the warm spell across Ontario

A stationary, abnormally strong high-pressure area

across eastern North America was the cause for the historic warm spell across Ontario, which started around March 14. Record temperatures tumbled by the dozen every day.

Some extraordinary examples from this historic event, to convey a sense of its scale: It was unprecedented in its duration and scope. It affected all of Eastern Canada, from Manitoba to Nova Scotia, and lasted for upwards of 10 consecutive days. Windsor recorded a full 10 consecutive days of 20 degrees or more. Kitchener had eight days at, or over, 20°C.

Altogether, close to 250 records were annihilated in Ontario alone, including those broken in a warm spell earlier in the month. It was undoubtedly a record for the most number of records set.

The maximum temperature of 28.8°C reported in Petawawa on March 21 is the highest temperature ever recorded in

Ontario in March.

Many locales surpassed their all-time highest temperatures for a single March day. Several locations even recorded their warmest March day, only to break that mark the next day with an even hotter temperature.

Severe Weather

While the big weather story in March was the summer-like conditions experienced across much of the province around mid-month, there were some significant storm events as well.

Between the afternoon hours of March 2 and the evening hours of March 3, an intense low-pressure system tracked from the Chicago area through Lake Huron, then into the North Bay area, and then into southwestern Quebec. The system produced a significant snowfall in parts of the Near North. Sault Ste. Marie recorded more than 25 centimetres, while the Greater Sudbury and North Bay areas picked up 15 to 20 centimetres. In

southern and eastern Ontario, the biggest impacts were related to strong winds generated by the intensity of the storm system and the passage of a sharp cold front associated with that system. Powerful wind gusts began in the Windsor area during the early morning hours of March 3, with the winds picking up in the Ottawa area later that same morning. Many localities reported wind gusts in the range of 80 to 100 kilometres per hour, with the strongest gust of 113 kilometres per hour recorded at Long Point along the north shore of Lake Erie. The winds caused tree limbs to fall across the area and also caused a number of power outages.

With the mid-month change from winter-like to summer-like conditions, came

the return of summer-like severe thunderstorms. On the evening of March 15, a warm front extended from southern Lake Huron to the St. Lawrence Valley in eastern Ontario. That warm front acted as a focus for significant thunderstorm activity across southern Ontario. Between approximately 10 p.m. on March 15 and 6 a.m. on March 16, a series of thunderstorms rolled through the Peterborough area, dumping a significant amount of rain. From available rain gauges in the area, official amounts were only in the 30- to 40-millimetre range, but unofficially the amounts were likely much larger due to the highly localized nature of the heaviest rain. These series of storms caused notable flooding in parts of the city.

Maison Boreal Home Reaches a Stepping-Stone

On April 26, a delegation from the Maison Boreal Home committee attended a meeting of the District Services Board (DSB) for Manitoulin-Sudbury, held in Espanola. DSB is a body that evaluates submissions from groups that are planning projects. If the proposal is deemed worthy of support, DSB will recommend it for funding assistance.

Along with written documentation, DSB members received a presentation by Pierrette Ouellette, group spokesperson. She outlined the 5 year history of Chapleau's assisted living project. This project began with a survey to define people's needs. A major concern is that people do not want to be moved away to an unfamiliar community, far from family and friends, when they need help with daily living. She described Maison Boreal Home's answer to this issue – a 32- unit residence in downtown Chapleau. Providing affordable housing to seniors is vital to this project. The proposed location would help in the renewal of the downtown core, as well as keep residents truly a part of daily community action.

was told that DSB will study the proposal closely and their response should be ready by the end of May. They were encouraged to seek partnerships for the project. DSB members said they were impressed by the level of work done by the committee, and their presentation.

Byham was present as a member of the DSB. He commented that Chapleau's town council is unanimous in supporting the project. In summing up he said "This presentation to the Manitoulin-Sudbury District Service Board is a stepping stone, and now we go forward."


