Sometime during the previous night, the Protestant Cemetery on Birch Street was vandalized, leaving thirty four headstones overturned.

This day will probably be long lasting in Chapleau citizens' memories. Not only did the vandals upset families of the deceased but also took part in damaging monuments that are part of Chapleau's history.

This irrational and insensitive type of vandalism has offended and saddened the people of our community and we will be reminded of it

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

I am writing in reply to letters from Michael Cachagee and Ian White (October 6). I apologize for the delay in responding but I was traveling out of the Province between October 7 and October 22.

To the best of my knowledge, Mr. Cachagee is neither a lawyer nor a constitutional expert and I suggest his rant should be viewed in the light of that caveat. It is interesting to note that the Chapleau Game Preserve was established in 1925 and it took some people about 75 years to decide that it violated some "constitutional" rights. Mr. Cachagee seems not to understand the extent of the problem facing the Brunswick House Band in 1925. There were simply no animals for them to trap in the area of their Reserve within what became the Chapleau Game Preserve. Their choice was either to move or starve. That having been said, there is no excuse whatsoever for the way the Brunswick House people were treated either in 1925 or in the years that followed. Few people (if any) have written about their plight as extensively and sympathetically as I have.

Mr. Cachagee writes about some sort of cryptic message in one of my letters. That is nonsense. I don't do cryptic stuff. It is common knowledge that, this fall, large numbers of moose have been taken inside the Game Preserve - in addition to hundreds of Chapleau River. I make no apology for my comments on these matters.

Mr. Ian White makes reference to my grandfather being euchered in what he visioned for the "Park". That is simply not true. The "Park" turned out exactly the way William McLeod hoped it would. Mr. White mentions the denial of the Native People of there [sic] food supply of moose and deer. In fact, there were no deer in the "Park" at the time and virtually no moose. My grandfather's position on the taking of moose for subsistence purposes is well illustrated by his successful defense (1937) of Simon Jackpine when he was charged with killing a moose near Sultan in order to feed the his (Jackpine's) family. My grandfather won an acquittal for Mr. Jackpine in court in Chapleau and that acquittal was not appealed by the Crown.

Contrary to what Mr. White suggests, I am certainly not rejoicing about what is happening in the Game Preserve. I would point out to him that few people did more than my grandfather (and also my father) to advance the welfare of Aboriginals in and around Chapleau. Mr. White might be well advised to read what Vince Crichton had to say about William McLeod in the book

"Pioneering in Northern Ontario". Although my grandfather died before I was born, I feel very comfortable taking the position that he would be appalled by the greedy and irresponsible hunting and gill netting that has been going on in and around the Game Preserve. He would, I think, be equally appalled by the letters of Michael Cachagee and Ian White.

Mr. White refers to a change in some sort of plan as a result of something done by G.B. Nicholson. In more than eight years of research, I have yet to find any documented evidence of any involvement in the Chapleau Game Preserve by Mr. Nicholson. He was a FEDERAL Member of Parliament and the Game Preserve was a PROVINCIAL matter. The only "change" that I know of was the shift in the southern boundary of the Preserve from the high water line to the mid-point of the Chapleau River.

Mr. White concludes his letter with a reference to the Aboriginal practice of taking only what was needed for survival. That is an interesting comment in the light of the moose slaughter and the garbage pails full of pickerel being netted in the Chapleau River and Mr. White's apparent lack of concern about this behavior.

I would infer from their letters that Michael Cachagee and Ian White seem to think

that two wrongs make a right. That is never the case.

I do understand the anger and frustration that Aboriginals must feel after so many years of mistreatment and abuse - all across the country. With respect to the Brunswick House descendents, I would suggest that they have a number of very legitimate quarrels. One, of course, is the 25 cents per acre of compensation their ancestors received for their Reserve on Missinaibi Lake. The other quarrels are surely with the Federal Department of Indian Affairs, the Chapleau Indian Agents and their fellow travelers in the Anglican Church. For decades, the church's clergy and bishops did nothing to help the Brunswick House folks in their shuffle from Missinaibi Lake to Elsas to Tophet and eventually to Duck Lake. What went on at both of the Anglican Residential Schools in Chapleau was far beyond the proverbial pale.

In closing, I think it is fair to suggest that great men like my grandfather build things and think unselfishly with long term visions for the greater good of society. Others tear down and destroy for their own immediate and selfish gratification. Guess who fit into the latter category.

Mayor Freeborn praises accomplishments of the Public Works Committee



When I first came on Council in 1998 one of my first concerns was the lack of public input and involvement in Council activities. Subsequently our Council resurrected the Standing Committee System and created the Public Works committee.

This committee is composed of members of the public and members of the Council who meet regularly to assess the condition of our roads, sidewalks, refuse service, water & sewer systems, landfill site, airport and the public works vehicles and equipment. They also

take part in the planning of the snow removal program in the winter months and street cleaning in the summer months.

This committee makes recommendations to the Council which helps the Council in their decisions to address the above mentioned services.

One of the services that our Council has enhanced is the snow removal and sanding of most of our busiest sidewalks in the winter. With the purchase of a new sidewalk cleaning machine our citizens can now walk safely on well plowed and sanded sidewalks and access the schools, post office, pharmacy, churches and local business establishments . We have extended this service to the limits of our manpower and budget. The Public

Works Committee has encouraged the Council to continue the annual sidewalk rehabilitation program, to repair and rebuild sections of the

sidewalks which have deteriorated over the years. Because of the input and vision that the Public Works Committee has provided the Council the future of Chapleau's services, the renewal of our vehicles and equipment and the plans for the upgrading of our underground

services have been established. As the Mayor of our community I sit on and attend all of the Public Works Committee meetings.
