Nishnawbe Aski Nation (NAN) is an Aboriginal political organization representing 49 First Nation communities within James Bay Treaty 9 territory and the Ontario portions of Treaty 5. NAN territory covers two-thirds of the province of Ontario

On August 12th NAN held its elections during the XXVIII Keewaywin Chiefs Conference held here in

Chapleau. Grand Chief Stan Beardy was re-elected and two new Deputy Grand Chiefs, Mike Metatawabin and Les Louttit were elected by the Chiefs to lead the new term of office.

Wade Cachagee, of Niska North Inc. gave a tour of the Niska North facilities to Deputy Grand Chief Mike Metatawabin and Deputy Grand Chief Les Louttit. They welcomed the opportunity to take a tour of the aboriginally owned facility. They are both promoters of Aboriginal owned businesses and encourage economic development for members of the NAN territory. Wade has a pro-active working relationship with Mike

Metatawabin when they both served as Chiefs of their communities and served on the

Mushkegowuk Council of Chiefs.

Niska North promotes First Nation projects and sees great promise working with NAN communities in future years to come.

Also during the assembly Wade Cachagee of Niska North presented Josias Fiddler, a very well respected NAN Elder with some cedar blocks which he will use to make ceremonial pipes for cultural ceremonies. I've known Josias for many years and it was an honour to have him visit our facility and also to provide him with this special gift" says Wade Cachagee.

"Lots of NAN members look up to Josias and numerous

Soo area men charged with mischief



On Thursday midnight, vandalism, evening, once again, showed its ugly head. The WW1

German mortar that has been displayed for more than 40 years in front of the Royal Canadian Legion Branch #5 was turned upside down, causing considerable damage to it.

Subject: The announcement of the removal of Greyhound Bus Service:

Regarding the recent announcement by

the Greyhound Bus Company that they intend to discontinue bus service between Sault Ste. Marie Ontario and Winnipeg Manitoba, I write this letter on behalf of my Council and the citizens of Chapleau.

Removal of the service mentioned above is completely unacceptable. The citizens of this community and the other communities along highway 17 who require transportation between Sault Ste. Marie and

Winnipeg to access the western part of our country and to be able to return will now be without bus service.

I want to remind the Federal Government that when they discontinued the Via Transcontinental Train Service on the CPR line some years ago they assured the citizens of this part of the country that the Greyhound Bus Company had agreed to add additional vehicles and staff to "take up the slack" and provide adequate transportation for the citizens who were affected by the removal of the Via

Service.

Citizens of this great country are being treated as though they don't count in the greater scheme of things just because they live in a certain part of this country. I must remind the Federal and Provincial Governments that they cannot allow the citizens of this part of the country to be land locked without a mode of transportation. Not everyone has an automobile and even those that do elect to use public transportation especially in the winter months when the weather makes the highways treacherous. Seniors depend on this bus service to access specialty health care in the cities of Sault Ste. Marie and Thunder Bay and I assume that the same is true for the citizens of Manitoba who depend on this service to travel to the city of Winnipeg.

I humbly request that our Governments do not allow the removal of this very important transportation service, and I look forward to your response to this request so that I can share this information with my Council and the citizens of Chapleau.

Chapleau High School student predicts wireless phones in 1932!

Chapleau Moments
by Michael J. Morris



In 1932, Donald Boucher, who was in Form 1A (Grade 9) at Chapleau High School wrote in the school magazine 'Static' that within 50 years, "it will be possible to phone a person on a wireless phone and to see the person's image reflected on a screen at the same time." He was only a few years off on his fearless prediction as we now take wireless communication with video for granted.

Donald made some other observations that he said were "commonly heard nowadays" (in 1932) including one that cities would be heated from one huge central heating plant, adding that buildings "will be so high and huge that streets will be necessary at different levels."

Interesting comments from a Grade 9 student. I have been reading the souvenir newspaper published in 1982 to mark the 60th anniversary of CHS, and here are some of my discoveries about the people and events at the school in its earlier years, in no particular order.

In 1931 Olive Vezina told the High School News that "public school boys are much more entertaining than high school boys"

while students wondered what would happen if Doug Beacock didn't talk to 'Mr. Mac' (John McClellan, the long time teacher and CHS principal) about professional hockey, while the only comment made by Ted Young was "Oh fudge."

Jumping ahead to 1952, I wonder how many recall that Earle Freeborn, now the mayor, was part of a barber shop quartet that "serenaded" students at one of its productions. Earle was accompanied by Leo Vezina, John Houghton and John Longchamps.

Hundreds of Chapleauites packed the theatre in the old Town Hall in 1956 when John "Mac" McClellan retired as principal after 30 years at the school. Tributes poured in from former students which also recognized his work with Number 1187, Chapleau High School Cadet Corps. "Mac" as he was fondly known likely defined the school more than anyone in its history. The Austin-McClellan Scholarship was named in his honour.

In 1959 CHS was an extremely active place. At the annual commencement Harry Pellow was the valedictorian, while Jimmy Evans and Mary Serre received the top

academic awards, having graduated the previous year. A basketball team had been formed coached by teacher Richard Murchland which challenged other groups to play it. Players were Louis Fortin, David Mizuguchi, Ron Morris, Michael Morris, Jim Schafer, Bill McLeod and Lawrence Comte and Robert Lemieux. (As an aside, something I just realized is that Robert Lemieux and I later taught at CHS) Nelson Eveline and Bruce Poynter had attended cadet camp and were new instructors.

The wiener roast at Bucciarelli Beach was an annual CHS social event for many years and we will all have our own memories of them. In 1944 Noreen Delaney was the announcer assisted by John Thomson. The "Rhythm Boys", John Thomson, Doug Jardine, Keith McKnight and Neil Dowsley sang the popular hit, 'Ma, she's making eyes at me.' In 1945 the rationing of meat meant a change from wiener roast to bean feed but reports said it did not dampen the enthusiasm, with a trumpet duet by George Tremblay and George Payette a highlight of the evening.

In 1963 CHS was the place to be with John Murray as president of the student council and Dr. Karl A. Hackstetter as principal. Dr Hackstetter first taught at CHS from 1954 to 1957, and returned as principal.

James Pullen was editor of Ad Astra and Charlie Purich was referred to as the "catalyst" of the hockey team. Some Grade 9 students listed included Ted Swanson, Bruce McCarthy, Leslie Zufelt, Kathy Fife, John Reid, Gary Coulter, Judy Corston, David Morris, Harvey Brilliant and Candy Corston.


The chairpersons of the 1982 60th CHS reunion, the late Alex Babin and Margaret Rose (Payette) Fortin were both grads of the school, who at the time were on the teaching staff. It is believed that Clarence Fiaschetti was the first CHS grad to return and teach there.

In 1964 the yearbook revealed that Jim St. Amand's main interest was hockey while Ian Clegg enjoyed skiing and apparently George

Ritchie wanted to beat Howard Higuchi in Physics. Hugh McKechnie (later at teacher at CHS) was instrumental in the destruction of many a history class and Ron Doig was a member of the table tennis club.


There are so many great moments in the history of Chapleau High School that I will stop for the moment, and let those of you who attended the school reflect on your time there. I will share more of the people and

the times later. For me, who started high school in 1955 in "Mr. Mac's" final year as principal and was greatly influenced by him and Dr. Karl A. Hackstetter, and later returned in 1969 to teach there, Chapleau High School has always been much more than a place to go to school. 

Consuming liquor in public – On September 6, 2009 Chapleau officers investigated two related Liquor Licence Act infractions. The first incident occurred around 11:10 am when officers noted a group of male subjects having what appeared to be a tail-gate party directly across from a marked OPP cruiser. Observations

confirmed that one of the subjects was noted to be consuming an alcoholic beverage and a Provincial Offence Notice was issued. A short time later officers patrolling the Golf Course Road near Chapleau again noted the same group walking along the road and another male was noted to be consuming what appeared to be an alcoholic beverage.

Once again, a second male subject was issued a ticket for consuming alcohol in other than a residence or licensed premises.

Labels for Education at Chapleau Public School

Last year we began a program at the Chapleau Public School called "Labels for Education." to 10 000 points!



In this community we have drop off points at the Best Start Hub (the toy library), the Chapleau Child Care Centre, the Valu-Mart and Cedar Grove. The

labels must be a Campbell's product. These include, Campbell's soups and broths, Habitant soups, V8 products, Pace salsa, Prego sauces and Pepperidge Farm Goldfish crackers.

In order to collect points for a label, we need the whole label from soup cans and beverage containers but only the UPC code from Goldfish crackers or soup and broth cartons. For micro-waveable products, such as, Chunky to Go, Ready at Hand soups and Hearty Instant Noodles, we need only the plastic cap.

We thank you for the support we have received in the past year and look forward to this coming year as we seek to the support the Chapleau Public School in this way.
